Louisville Seminary's Lela N. Rhodes Memorial Garden is a tranquil site on campus where individuals can rest in God's peace or honor loved ones with a brass plaque placed on the garden wall. It's nestled in a park-like setting where family and friends often return and share memories of their loved ones.

This cross was commissioned in 2008 by Metalwork Artist, C.D. Weaver, of Austin, TX.

"It was the tears of the Lord, which raised Lazarus to new life. The cross marks this Memorial Garden as hallowed ground, a place where the tears of God have fallen, and as a place where the creative, life-giving love of God is everlasting," Weaver says.



THE MEMORIAL GARDEN


is located at the chancel end of the Frank H. and Fannie W. Caldwell Chapel. This area is bordered on three sides by a stone wall and is easily accessible from the parking lot at the far end of Nelson Hall, along Chapel Valley Way.

The Garden is named in honor of Lela N. Rhodes, who served as Bookstore Manager at Louisville Seminary from 1967 to 1985. Along with her husband, Dr. Arnold Black Rhodes, Professor Emeritus of Old Testament, who died in 2002, Mrs. Rhodes was an integral part of the Louisville Seminary community for more than sixty years until her death in 2016.

Individuals with strong ties to the Seminary and who desire to have their ashes committed to the ground are welcome to be interred in Memorial Garden.

All arrangements for interment services, including delivery of ashes to the Louisville Seminary campus, shall be the responsibility of family members of the deceased or their designee, and shall be coordinated through the Office of Institutional Advancement. While exceptions may be granted, two weeks advance notice for services held Monday-Friday is required. If the family will not be present for internment, a Service of Committal will be offered.

An interment fee includes the cost of a bronze plaque. The 10" x 4" plaque will bear the name, date of birth, and date of death of



the deceased. Space for two lines of personal words can also be included. Each plaque is mounted onto metal lattice work.

Gifts to the Memorial Garden Endowment Fund are welcome at any time and will be used for maintenance and future enhancements of the Garden. All gifts and fees should be made payable to Louisville Presbyterian Theological Seminary, and designated for the Memorial Garden Endowment Fund on the check. If you wish to memorialize your loved one somewhere else on campus, contact the Office of Institutional Advancement for other opportunities.
