Facilities Information

CHECK-OUT INSPECTIONS

For those of you who will be moving off campus, the Facilities Department wants to remind you to call or email us to schedule your check-out inspection. This must be done to ensure the return of your deposit when you began your lease. We check for cleanliness of the entire unit including the bathroom sink, toilet, and tub, refrigerator and stove both inside and out. We also check the condition of screens, blinds, cabinets, countertops, walls (holes from pictures, mirrors, etc.), fixtures and furniture provided in the studio/efficiency units. It is preferable to schedule the check-out as close to your departure as possible so we can ensure all above items are completed to ensure prompt return of any deposits. It is not necessary that the unit be completely empty for the check-out. **Please be sure you also clear out your storage unit. Any items left will be discarded.**

If you could, **please schedule these a week** in advance. We would greatly appreciate it.

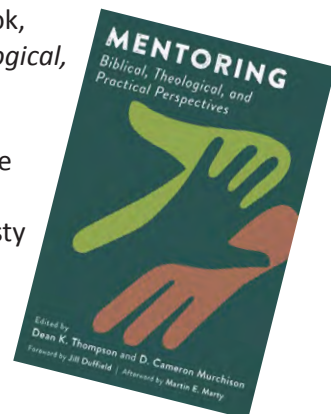

New Life in Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) is the only prison congregation in Kentucky and is located at Diersen House (1218 W. Oak St.), a detention facility and halfway house for women. Louisville Seminary is one of several outside communities of faith who have led worship and volunteer at the facility on Tuesday evenings. Each week New Legacy Café provides desserts for the fellowship hour. Dr. Dianne Reistroffer and LPTS alumna Rev. Nicole Hardin serve on the Mission Behind Bars and Beyond Board of Directors, the umbrella organization for NLIC.

LPTS is scheduled to lead worship at New Life in Christ on Tuesday, July 10, at 7 p.m. Rev. J. Stephens is tentatively scheduled to be



our keyboardist and music leader. Dr. Reistroffer will preach. We are looking for volunteers from the community to join us as we sing and give praise to God and encourage the women at Diersen. For that hour of worship, the world is changed for those detained behind these walls. Joys and concerns are shared. A sermon is given. Hymns are sung. Bread and cup are offered, and hope is restored to these women who are remembered, supported, and encouraged by those visiting and by their outstanding pastor, Rev. Carol Wieger, and other faithful volunteers. Following the worship service, our friends from New Legacy Café will provide a meal. Visitors older than 18 are welcome.
