Writing Tables continue on Monday afternoons through the summer, 3:30 – 5 p.m.

The ASC's weekly Writing Tables have been well utilized by students wishing to brush up on their grammar basics, writing and reading skills.

In July, our sessions focus on the Writing Process (planning, pre-writing, outlines and organization) and Developing Thesis Statements.

In August, we'll look at Revising, Summarizing, Quoting and Documentation, Study Skills and Time Management.

Join us in **Schlegel, Room 206**

Come to one or all of the Writing Tables, depending on your summer schedule and your particular writing needs.

Schedule overview:

- July 17: Approaching the Writing Process – Explore types and purposes of writing, review the basic writing process. Plan-write-revise, unpack writing assignments to create plans for completing them.
 - July 24: Thesis Statements and Introductions – The introductory paragraph is more than a simple road map of your paper. It contains a thesis statement – it states a claim (thesis) that will be supported in the body of the paper. Review writing assignments and practice developing thesis statements.
 - July 31: Pre-writing, organization, thinking through what you want to write. Putting thoughts and responses into a coherent whole.
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- August 7: Revision, editing and proofreading – Rereading your writing for cohesion, transitions, conclusions, supporting your thesis, and grammar check.
 - August 14: Research, quotations, summarizing information into your writing. Summarize/paraphrase, academic honesty and plagiarism. Direct quotes and indirect quotes, when to cite/attribute.
 - August 21: Documentation Workshop: Chicago/Turabian, and APA. Practice in-text/footnote citations and bibliography/reference pages.
 - August 28: Study Skills: Time Management. Reading, writing and planning for the read/re-write/write/revise process. Create overview calendar of the semester.
