## Field Education

### Students in Field Education for A/Y 2018-2019

Students placed in church placements for 2018-2019 must register in the Field Ed office (SH 104) for their Field Education experience. The Field Education registration form is online in the [Field Ed section of the Seminary's website](#). In addition, a **sexual misconduct form** must also be submitted to the Field Ed Office. Finally, students in Congregational, Agency and On-Campus placements must submit **one** original, signed copy of their Administrative Agreement and Learning Covenant by Wednesday, September 19. Both of these forms can be found online with the Field Ed Registration Form. **Remember that all Field Education Paperwork must be turned in within two weeks of the stated deadline.**

### CPE Application Training

On Tuesday, October 2, the Field Ed Office will host a meeting on properly completing a CPE application. Students planning to do a basic unit of CPE, especially during summer 2019, should attend this meeting. Applications for summer 2019 CPE will be due before/by Wednesday, November 7.

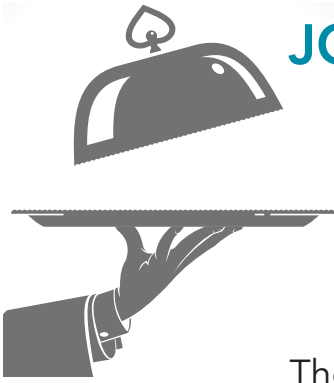

## From the Academic Support Center (ASC)

### Helpful Resources to Begin the Semester

#### Calendly

The ASC (as well as other offices on campus) uses the Calendly scheduling program to allow for simplified appointment scheduling by students.

- ◆ When you type in a person's calendly account into your search bar, you are taken directly to the person's scheduling page where you may select 15-, 30- or 45-minute appointments on specific days.
- ◆ You select the day and time to meet within the open days and times of the person you want to meet with. Type in your name and contact info onto the time slot, follow the prompts on the page.
- ◆ The person you want to meet with receives an email from calendly telling about the appointment.

The Center for Innovation in Ministry at the San Francisco Theological Seminary is pleased to announce a new pastoral care conference called, **Beyond Pink & Blue – Transitions and Transgender Care.**”

This conference will launch both in-person, running October 21<sup>st</sup>-23<sup>rd</sup> in-person at Westminster Presbyterian Church in Charlottesville, Virginia, and online, running October 22<sup>nd</sup>-24<sup>th</sup>, for those who cannot be there due to travel distance. The online seminar will be hosted using video-conference provider Zoom and moderated by a trained teaching assistant in the area of pastoral care.

Why you should register:

- **You identify as Transgender** and seek a deeper spiritual connection with God, other lay-people, or your spiritual community.
- **You are a Chaplain, Pastor, or other Church leader** and wish to better understand the complexities of dealing with gender equality issues in your area of expertise.
- **You are a hospital case worker, or therapist**, who wants to deepen your knowledge of the dynamic tension surrounding this hot-button topic.

“The Center is always looking for ways to be on the growing edge of ministry, across all areas and issues in the United States. This is not an outlier issue. Statistics of abuse and suicide are alarming and pervasive. Our Christian faith requires us to always care for people who are being marginalized,” states Floyd Thompkins, Director of the Center for Innovation in Ministry.

Indeed, forty-percent of persons identifying as transgender have attempted suicide at least once. This is a staggering figure, and one that should spur action. We are an organization of discourse – and action.

We hope to provide avenues for spiritual discourse – in a respectful way – both in person and in the “cloud.”

Speakers include luminaries in this field and will be sure to excite spirited discussion.
