Exterior Christmas lights are not allowed on any building. We also ask respectfully that you avoid burning candles for your safety and that of the fellow residents of the Seminary Housing Community.

CHRISTMAS TREES AND CHRISTMAS TREE SAFETY

We would like to remind all residents who choose to have a live Christmas tree that it is always best to recut the base of the tree once you get it home, to insure that the tree can begin taking water again. Once you have installed your freshly cut tree into a proper tree stand, give the tree as much water as it can possibly absorb and remember to check the tree's water supply every day. This will insure that you have the freshest tree possible through the holiday season.

Please remember to use only UL listed indoor lights and try not to decorate your tree with dry or flammable items. Please remember that you should always unplug your Christmas lights when sleeping or away from home. Leaving your lights plugged in when you are asleep or not home can be very dangerous and is a serious fire hazard.

The Seminary does not dispose of Christmas trees. However, the city of Louisville and the city of St. Matthews both have Christmas tree recycling programs. We encourage everyone with a live tree to take advantage of these offered programs, and ask that no trees be placed in or beside the dumpsters.

The season of paper writing is upon us! Once you finished your tome, your job is far from over!

You have entered the **revision** stage.

Good writers rewrite.

The best writers rewrite a lot.

Mark Twain revised his famous book Tom Sawyer 73 times!

Revision is basically "re-visioning" your writing. There are two types of revision: global and local. We'll look at global revision first because that's what you should do first. Global revision looks at the entire piece of writing.

Before you begin to revise, if at all possible, let your writing sit for a while—at least overnight.

Here are the steps of global revision:

Change perspectives and reread your piece writing as if you were the reader not the author. Distance yourself from the text and evaluate the writing in terms of its rhetorical effect. Ask yourself these questions

- Does the writing meet the requirements of the assignment?
- Does the text "speak" to a specific audience (i.e. theologians, congregants, or children)?
- Is there an introductory paragraph with a thesis statement that tells the reader your position on the subject?
- Are there enough details to support your position?
- Is the logic valid?
- Do the major points connect to the thesis?
- Is there a conclusion that gives the reader a sense of closure?

With this new perspective on your paper you might need to:

- Change the focus, perhaps by rewriting the introduction and/or modifying the thesis
- Re-order the evidence
- Eliminate or add details
- Add a conclusion



As you may have read, the city's homeless community has suffered two deaths this week, attributed in part to exposure. And this is just the very beginning of what is looking to be a long, cold winter.

Sherry Arconti volunteers with a small group called **Keep Louisville Warm**. We work with several other small organizations (including Fed With Faith, Exit 0, My Dog Eats First, Burrito Riders) to provide a warm meal, clothes and heating and sheltering supplies to people in need.

KEEP LOUISVILLE WARM

Right now, they need heating supplies—the safest, most economical and best thermal cost/value of which are cans of sterno. One can provides roughly 6-8 hours of warmth for one or two people. It's not much, but that bit of warmth is literally the difference between life and death for folks who cannot find room or safety at the shelters.

The next week will include several very cold nights. Sherry is holding a small supplies-gathering drive. Please know that small gifts are a great

kindness. Consider the dignity of the recipients as you look at your closets.

If you have...

- *winter coats, thermal shirts or undergarments or socks
- *men's or women's jeans, sweatpants, sturdy shoes in good condition
- * spare camping equipment, especially tarps, small tents, sleeping bags and blankets
- * gym bags/backpacks
- * cans of sterno or small (camp stove style) propane tanks, or cash for the purchase of these things
- * portable, individually wrapped shelf-stable snacks
- * an interest in helping to cook a hot meal for about 150-200 people










LESSONS AND CAROLS
