HOW TO USE GOOGLE SCHOLAR

Search for journal articles and ebooks with Google Scholar

- Google Scholar is a database of reliable academic journal articles and ebooks.

- Articles or ebooks can be searched via title, author, subject, or key word(s). Be as specific as possible in your search criteria

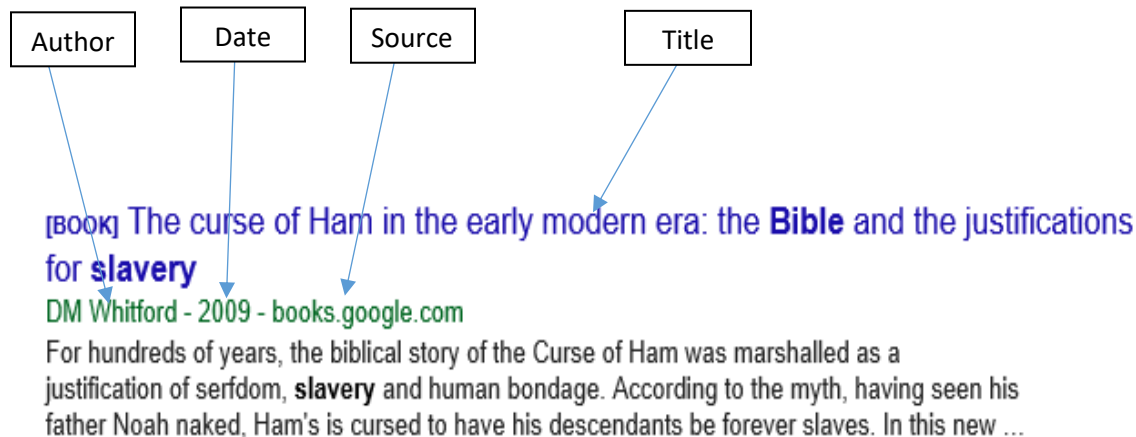

- Google scholar will return a list of resources that most closely matches your criteria.

- A PDF or HTML link will be located to the right of articles and ebooks that are available to view and/or to download. Click on this link to access the full article or ebook.

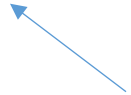

-  Provides citations in a variety of academic styles.

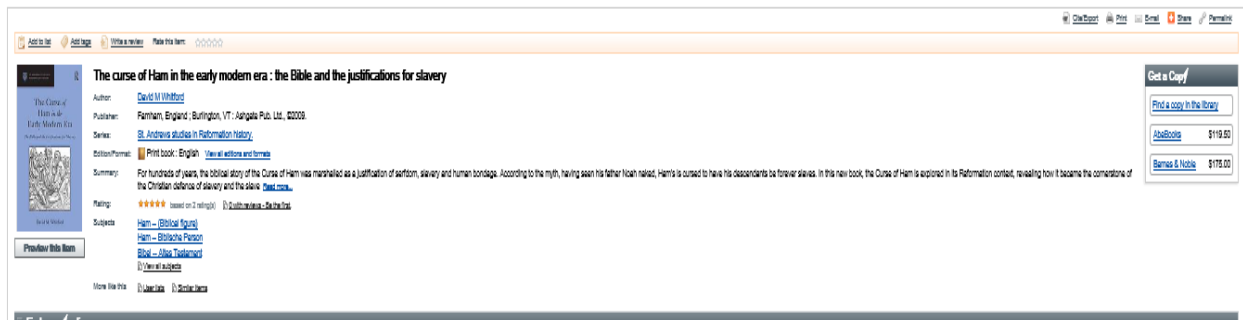
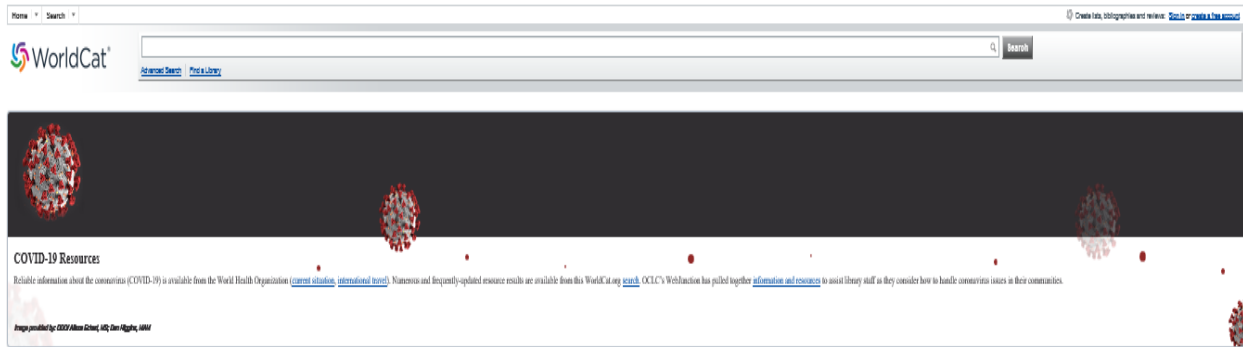
