Section I: Reformed Confessional Heritage

You are the associate pastor at Second Presbyterian Church and lead a study session for elders. The class discusses the theme of power and the idea of corruption in *The Book of Confessions:*

| Corey: | There's a lot in the Bible accusing the rich of misusing their wealth, and that concern is reflected in some of the confessions, too. The abuse of wealth is a straightforward definition of corruption, don't you think? |

| Seiha: | Corruption is not necessarily the misuse of wealth, but of any kind of power. What does God expect of people when they have some power in society? |
| Brayan: | Aren't we all corrupt, whether we have power or not? Isn't corruption just another way of talking about sin? |

- 1. Write an essay discussing a Reformed understanding of **power and corruption.** In the essay, identify and discuss at least one (1) citation (e.g., 0.000) from each of three (3) different documents in *The Book of Confessions.*
- 2. Building on the essay in Required Response 1, respond directly to Corey, Seiha, and Brayan.

Section II: Constructive Statement of Christian Doctrine

You are the pastor of Grace Presbyterian Church. During a young adult class someone mentions being blessed by God. This begins a lively discussion about what people mean by "God's blessing."

| Mac: | Sometimes I think when people talk about blessing, they are simply describing good luck. | |

- 1. Write an essay discussing a Reformed understanding of **divine blessing**. In the essay, use at least two (2) of the following resources: the Scriptures, classical theology (sources before 1900), modern theology (sources since 1900).
- 2. Building on the essay in Required Response 1, prepare an annotated outline for a topical sermon on ways people may experience God's blessing. For the purpose of this exam, an annotated outline is an outline with explanatory notes.

Section III: Application to Ministry

You are pastor of Emmanuel Presbyterian Church. After walking around the local neighborhood with members of the outreach and evangelism committee, the following discussion ensues:

| Martha: | There is so much sin in our community! A lot of people are going to hell if they don't repent! |
