## Course Description

Revelation poses a great challenge to interpreters today. The New Testament exegete's usual difficulties in trying to bridge twenty centuries are amplified by longstanding disagreements over how to interpret John's apocalyptic style and widespread misconceptions about the content and purpose

of the book. In this course, you will familiarize yourself with the content of Revelation and with competing interpretive models for it, work through its various exegetical challenges, and formulate your own constructive ideas about the relevance and possible applications of the book for the church today. The format of the class will include short lectures, discussions, short student presentations, and breakout group discussions. Exegesis will be based on the English text, but students who have studied Greek will be encouraged to use it.

## Intended Learning Outcomes

*Upon completion of the course, you will be able to:*

1. Summarize the scholarly consensus on such historical-critical issues as authorship, the genre of the book and its significance for our interpretation of it, and likely circumstances surrounding the composition of it.
2. Converse (or write) in an informed but general way about the shape and content of Revelation, and offer detailed exegetical analysis of a pericope of your choosing.
3. Speak cogently about how to preach or teach Revelation in ways that (a) benefit the church, (b) show awareness of competing interpretive models (such as premillennial dispensationalism), and (c) are informed by cultural perspectives that are non-dominant in the United States.

These learning outcomes are related to SLOs 1 and 6 for the MDiv and SLO 1 for the MAR. ***If you are an MDiv student, you should aim to produce at least one assignment suitable for use as an artifact in your senior portfolio.***

## Course Requirements

1. Regular class attendance, and active and informed participation. In advance of each class session you should carefully read and study the assigned chapters of Revelation, along with any secondary materials on the syllabus for that day. *Worth 10% of final grade; too many absences constitute grounds for failing the course.*
2. A one-page handout on one of the articles assigned for a given class session, summarizing its main points, and raising questions for discussion. You will present this summary to the class. You should submit the handout through Canvas at least one day *before* the session when the article will be discussed. 3. A notebook with summaries of readings, important takeaways from class sessions, and your own comments on the text of Revelation. An exegesis paper (8-10 double-spaced pages, not counting endnotes and bibliography) on a passage from Revelation that you have selected in consultation with me. **The due date is midnight on August 20** (submit electronically through Canvas). An extension is possible but *must* be cleared with me ahead of time, and any papers submitted late without an approved extension will be penalized.
